

ASSOCIATIONS INCORPORATION ACT 1981 - SCHEDULE 3

RULES FOR THE MOTORCYCLE RIDERS ASSOCIATION

NAME

1. The name of the incorporated association is THE MOTORCYCLE RIDERS ASSOCIATION OF AUSTRALIA LIMITED (in these rules called "the Association").

INTERPRETATION

2. (1) In these rules, unless the contrary intention appears :-
"Committee" means the Committee of Management of the Association.
"Financial year" means the year ending on 30th June.
"General Meeting" means a general meeting of members convened in accordance with Rule 11.
"Member" means a member of the Association.
"Ordinary Member of the Committee" means a member of the Committee who is not an officer of the Association under Rule 21.
"The Act" means the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.
"The Regulations" means regulations under the Act.
- (2) In these Rules, a reference to the secretary of an Association is a reference :-
(a) where a person holds office under these Rules as secretary of the Association - to that person; and
(b) in any other case, to the public officer of the Association
- (3) Words or expressions contained in these rules shall be interpreted in accordance with the provisions of the Acts Interpretation Act 1958 and the Act as in force from time to time.

OBJECTIVES

3. (1) The objectives of the Motorcycle Riders Association shall be
(a) To provide and promote a link between motorcyclists the Government its instrumentalities the general public and such body or bodies deemed necessary to serve the best interests of the Association.
(b) To support and promote other motorcycling bodies for the betterment of motorcycling.
(c) To promote improved road safety facilities and conditions mainly through road user education, driver awareness, and reasonable and practical legislations to protect motorcyclists safety on the road and their rights.
(d) To promote and improve the public image of motorcyclists by participating in charitable and community services and activities
(e) To provide services to the motorcycle community.

APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

4. (1) Any natural person who has an interest in the aims of the Association is eligible for membership on payment of the annual subscription payable under these Rules.
- (2) The Secretary shall, upon payment of the annual subscription,

enter the members name in the register of members kept by him.

- (3) A right, privilege or obligation of a person by reason of his membership of the Association ...-
- (a) Is not capable of being transferred or transmitted to another person.
- (b) Terminates upon the cessation of his membership whether by death or resignation or otherwise.
- (4) No member shall use the name of the Association or any names or titles registered by law to the Association for the purpose of personal profit or advancement or for the profit of some other company or organisation without written permission of the Association. Permission is only to be granted subject to the majority vote of the Committee.
- (5) The Association membership badges, although sold to members, shall remain the property of the Association and shall be returned when a member retires from the Association.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION

5. Annual membership fee of the Association is \$10.00, payable upon application for membership.

REGISTER OF MEMBERS

6. The secretary shall keep and maintain a register of members in which shall be entered the full name, address and date of entry of the name of each member and the register shall be available for inspection by members at the address of the Public Officer.

RESIGNATION AND EXPULSION OF MEMBERS

7.
 - (1) A member of the Association who has paid all moneys due and payable by him to the Association may resign from the Association by first giving one months notice in writing to the secretary of his intention to resign and upon the expiration of that period of notice, the member shall cease to be a member.
 - (2) Upon the expiration of a notice given under sub-clause (1) the secretary shall make in the register of members an entry recording the date on which the member by whom the notice was given, ceased to be a member.
 - (3) Subject to these rules, the Committee may by resolution :-
 - (a) Expel a member from the Association :
 - (b) suspend a member from membership of the Association for a specified period; or
 - (c) If the Committee is of the opinion that the member -
 - (i) has refused or neglected to comply with these rules; or
 - (ii) has been guilty of conduct unbecoming a member or

prejudicial to the interests of the Association.

- (4) A resolution of the Committee under sub-clause (1): -
- (a) does not take effect unless the Committee, at a meeting held not earlier than 14 and not later than 28 days after the service on the member of a notice under sub-clause (3) confirms the resolution in accordance with this clause; and
 - (b) where the member exercises a right of appeal to the Association under this clause does not take effect unless the Association confirms the resolution in accordance with this clause.
- (5) Where the Committee passes a resolution under sub-clause (1), the secretary shall, as soon as practicable, cause to be served on the member a notice in writing :-
- (a) setting out the resolution of the Committee and the grounds on which it is based;
 - (b) stating that the member may address the Committee at a meeting to be held not earlier than 14 and not later than 28 days after service of the notice;
 - (c) stating the date, place and time of that meeting;
 - (d) informing the member that he may do one or more of the following -
 - (i) Attend that meeting;
 - (ii) Give to the Committee before the date of that meeting a written statement seeking the revocation of the resolution;
 - (iii) Not later than 24 hours before the date of the meeting, lodge with the secretary a notice to the effect that he wishes to appeal to the Association in general meeting against the resolution.
- (6) At a meeting of the Committee held in accordance with sub-clause (2), the Committee :-
- (a) shall give to the member an opportunity to be heard;
 - (b) shall give due consideration to any written statement by the member; and
 - (c) shall by resolution determine whether to confirm or to revoke the resolution.

- (7) At a general meeting of the Association convened under sub-clause 5 :
- (a) The Committee may place before the meeting, details of the grounds for the resolution and the reasons for the passing of the resolution.
 - (b) The members shall be given an opportunity to be heard
 - (c) The members shall vote on the question whether the resolution should be confirmed or revoked upon a show of hands.
- (8) If at the general meeting -
- (a) Two thirds of the members vote in person in favour of the confirmation of the resolution the resolution is confirmed and :
 - (b) In any other case the resolution is revoked.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

8. (1) The Association shall in each calendar year convene an annual general meeting of its members.
- (2) The annual general meeting shall be held on such day as the Committee determines.
- (3) The annual general meeting shall be specified as such in the notice convening it.
- (4) The ordinary business of the annual general meeting shall be :
- (a) to confirm the minutes of the last preceding annual general meeting and of any general meeting held since that meeting;
 - (b) to receive from the Committee reports upon the transactions of the Association during the last preceding financial year;
 - (c) to elect officers of the Association and the ordinary members of the Committee; and
 - (d) to receive and consider the statement submitted by the Association in accordance with section 30 (3) of the Act.
- (5) The annual general meeting may transact special business of which notice is given in accordance with these rules.
- (6) The annual general meeting shall be in addition to any other general meetings that may be held in the same year.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

9. All general meetings other than the annual general meeting shall be called special general meetings.

NOTICE OF MEETING

- 10.
- (1) The Secretary of the Association shall at least fourteen days before the date fixed for holding the general meeting of the Association cause to be sent to each member of the Association at his address appearing in the register of members, a Notice by prepaid post or by suitable advertisement in a daily newspaper stating the place date and time of the meeting and the nature of the business to be transacted at the meeting.
 - (2) No business other than that set out in the notice convening the meeting shall be transacted at the meeting.
 - (3) A member desiring to bring any business before a meeting may give notice of that business in writing to the secretary, who shall include that business in the notice calling the next general meeting after the receipt of the notice.

PROCEEDINGS AT MEETING

- 11.
- (1) All business that is transacted at a special general meeting and all business that is transacted at the annual general meeting with the exception of that specially referred to in these rules as being the ordinary business of the annual general meeting shall be deemed to be special business.
 - (2) No item of business shall be transacted at a general meeting unless a quorum of members entitled under these rules to vote is present during the time when the meeting is considering that item.
 - (3) 50 members personally present (being members entitled under these rules to vote at a general meeting) constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of a general meeting
 - (4) If within half an hour after the appointed time for the commencement of a general meeting, a quorum is not present, the meeting if convened upon the requisition of members shall be dissolved and in any other case shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and (unless another place is specified by the Chairman at the time of adjournment or by written notice to members given before the day to which the meeting is adjourned) at the same place and if at the adjourned meeting the quorum is not present within half an hour after the time appointed for the commencement of the meeting, the members present (being not less than 3) shall be a quorum.

- (5) The President, or in his absence, the Vice-President, shall preside as Chairman at each general meeting of the Association.
- (6) If the President and the Vice-President are absent from a general meeting, the members present shall elect one of their number to preside as Chairman at the meeting.
- (7) The Chairman of a general meeting at which a quorum is present may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the meeting from time to time and place to place, but no business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting at which the adjournment took place.
- (8) Where a meeting is adjourned for 14 days or more, a like notice of the adjourned meeting shall be given as in the case of the general meeting.
- (9) Except as provided in sub-clauses (1) and (2) it is not necessary to give notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at an adjourned meeting.
- (10) A question arising at a general meeting of the Association shall be determined on a show of hands and unless before or on the declaration of the show of hands a poll is demanded, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or carried unanimously or carried by a particular majority or lost, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Association is evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of, or against, that resolution.
- (11) Upon any question arising at a general meeting of the Association, a member has one vote only.
- (12) All votes shall be given personally
- (13) In the case of an equality of voting on a question, the Chairman of the meeting is entitled to exercise a second or casting vote.
- (14) If at a meeting a poll on any question is demanded by not less than three members, it shall be taken at that meeting in such manner as the Chairman may direct and the resolution of the poll shall be deemed to be a resolution of the meeting on that question.
- (15) A poll that is demanded on the election of a Chairman or on a question of an adjournment shall be taken forthwith and a poll that is demanded on any other question shall be taken at such time before the close of the meeting as the Chairman may direct.
- (16) A member is not entitled to vote at any general meeting unless all moneys due and payable by him to the Association have been paid, other than the amount of the annual subscription payable in respect of the current

financial year.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

12.

- (1) The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Committee of Management constituted as provided in Rule 21.
- (2) The Committee :-
 - (a) shall control and manage the business and affairs of the Association.
 - (b) may subject to these rules, the regulations and the Act, exercise all such powers and functions as may be exercised by the Association other than those powers and functions that are required by these rules to be exercised by general meetings of the members of the Association; and
 - (c) subject to these rules, the regulations and the Act, has power to perform all such acts and things as appear to the Committee to be essential for the proper management of the business and affairs of the Association.
- (3) (1) The officers of the Association shall be :-
 - (a) a President;
 - (b) a Vice-President;
 - (c) a Treasurer; and
 - (d) a Secretary.
 - (e) a Membership Secretary.
- (2) The provisions of Rule 23 so far as they are applicable and with the necessary modifications, apply to and in relation to the election of persons to any of the offices mentioned in sub-clause (1).
- (3) Each officer of the Association shall hold office until the annual general meeting next after the date of his election but is eligible for re-election.
- (4) In the event of a casual vacancy in any office referred to in sub-clause (1) the Committee may appoint one of its members to the vacant office and the member so appointed may continue in office up to and including the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of his appointment.
- (5) Subject to Section 23 of the Act, the Committee shall consist of :-
 - (a) the officers of the Association; and
 - (b) 2 ordinary members -each by whom shall be elected at the general meeting of the Association in each year.

- (6) Each ordinary member of the Committee shall, subject to these rules, hold office until the annual general meeting next after the date of his election but is eligible for re-election.
- (7) In the event of a casual vacancy occurring in the office of an ordinary member of the Committee, the Committee may appoint a member of the Association to fill the vacancy and the member so appointed shall hold office, subject to these rules, until the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of his appointment.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS
AND VACANCY

- 13. (1) Nominations of candidates for election as officers of the Association or as ordinary members of the Committee :-
 - (a) shall be made in writing, signed by two members of the Association and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on the form of nomination); and
 - (b) shall be delivered to the secretary of the Association not less than 14 days before the date fixed for the holding of the annual general meeting.
- (2) If sufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies on the Committee, the candidates nominated shall be deemed to be elected and further nominations shall be received at the annual general meeting .
- (3) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated shall be deemed to be elected.
- (4) If the number of nominations exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, a ballot shall be held.
- (5) The ballot for the election of officers and ordinary members of the Committee shall be conducted at the annual general meeting in such usual and proper manner as the Committee may direct.
- (6) A nomination of a candidate for election under this clause is not valid if that candidate has been nominated for another office for election at the same election.

- (7) For the purposes of these rules, the office of an officer of the Association or of an ordinary member of the Committee becomes vacant if the officer or member -

- (a) ceases to be a member of the Association;
- (b) becomes an insolvent under administration within the meaning of the Companies (Victoria) Code; or
- (c) resigns his office by notice in writing given to the secretary.

PROCEDURE AT MEETINGS

- (1) The Committee shall meet at least 3 times in each year at such times as the Committee may determine.
- (2) Special meetings of the Committee may be convened by the President or by any 4 of the members of the Committee.
- (3) Notice shall be given to members of the Committee of any special meeting specifying the general nature of the business to be transacted and no other business shall be transacted at such a meeting.
- (4) Any 4 members of the Committee constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of a meeting of the Committee.
- (5) No business shall be transacted unless a quorum is present and if within half an hour of the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same place and at the same hour of the same day in the following week unless the meeting was a special meeting in which case it lapses.
- (6) At meetings of the Committee -
 - (a) the President or in his absence, the Vice-President shall preside; or
 - (b) if the President and the Vice-President are absent, such one of the remaining members of the Committee as may be chosen by the members present shall preside.
- (7) Questions arising at a meeting of the Committee or of any sub-committee appointed by the Committee shall be determined on a show of hands or, if demanded by a member, by a poll taken in such manner as the person presiding at the meeting may determine.
- (8) Each member present at a meeting of the Committee or of any sub-committee appointed by the Committee (including the person presiding at the meeting) is entitled to one vote and, in the event of an equality of votes on any question, the person presiding may exercise a second or casting vote.
- (9) Written notice of each committee meeting shall be served on each member of the Committee by delivering it to him at a reasonable time before the meeting or by sending it by pre-paid post addressed to him at his usual or last known place

of abode at least two business days before the date of the meeting.

- (10) Subject to sub-clause (4) the Committee may act notwithstanding any vacancy on the Committee.

SECRETARY

15. The Secretary of the Association shall keep minutes of the resolutions and proceedings of each general meeting and each committee meeting in books provided for that purpose together with a record of the names of persons present at committee meetings.

TREASURER

16. (1) The Treasurer of the Association :
- (a) shall collect and receive all moneys due to the Association and make all payments authorised by the Association; and
 - (b) shall keep correct accounts and books showing the financial affairs of the Association with full details of all receipts and expenditure connected with the activities of the Association
- (2) The accounts and books referred to in sub-clause (1) shall be available for inspection by members.

REMOVAL OF MEMBER OF COMMITTEE

17. (1) The Association in general meeting may by resolution remove any member of the Committee before the expiration of his term of office and appoint another member in his stead to hold office until the expiration of the term of the first-mentioned member.
- (2) Where the member to whom a proposed resolution referred to in sub-clause (1) makes representations in writing to the secretary or President of the Association (not exceeding a reasonable length) and requests that they be notified to the members of the Association, the secretary or the President may send a copy of the representations to each member of the Association or, if they are not so sent, the member may require that they be read out at the meeting.
- (3) The Committee may by majority, remove a Committee Member and appoint a new Committee Member at meetings of the Committee held under these rules.

CHEQUES

18. All cheques, drafts, bills of exchange, promissory notes and other negotiable instruments shall be signed by two members of the Committee.

SEAL

19. (1) The Common Seal of the Association shall be kept in the custody of the secretary.
- (2) The Common Seal shall not be fixed to any instrument except by the authority of the Committee and the affixing of the Common Seal shall be attested by the signatures either of two members of the Committee or of one member of the Committee and of the Public Officer of the Association.

ALTERATION OF RULES AND STATEMENT
OF PURPOSES

20. These rules and the statement of purposes of the Association shall not be altered except in accordance with the Act.

NOTICES

21. (1) A notice may be served by or on behalf of the Association upon any member either personally or by sending it by post to the member at his address shown in the Register of Members.
- (2) Where a document is properly addressed pre-paid and posted to a person as a letter, the document shall unless contrary is proved, be deemed to have been given to the person at the time at which the letter would have been delivered in the ordinary course of post.

WINDING UP OR CANCELLATION

22. In the event of the winding up or the cancellation of the incorporation of the Association, the assets of the Association shall be disposed of in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

CUSTODY OF RECORDS

23. Except as otherwise provided in these Rules, the secretary shall keep in his custody or under his control all books documents and securities of the Association.

FUNDS

24. The Funds of the Association shall be derived from entrance fees, annual subscriptions, donations and such other sources as the Committee determines.
